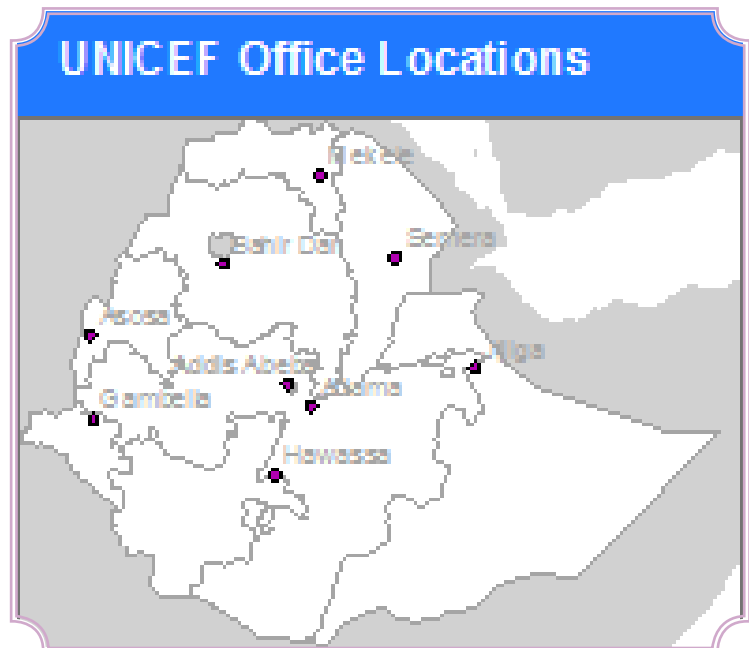

WHO WE ARE

MANDATE

UNIDO is the specialized agency of the United Nations that promotes industrial development for poverty reduction, inclusive globalization and environmental sustainability. The mandate of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO) is to promote and accelerate inclusive and sustainable industrial development in developing countries and economies in transition.



2013 Lima Declaration: Towards inclusive and sustainable industrial development. In recent years, UNIDO has assumed an enhanced role in the global development

agenda by focusing its activities on poverty reduction, inclusive globalization and environmental sustainability. The organization draws on four mutually reinforcing categories of services: technical cooperation, analytical and policy advisory services, standard setting and compliance, and a convening function for knowledge transfer and networking.

UNIDO's vision is a world where economic development is inclusive and sustainable and economic progress is equitable. The Organization focuses on three main thematic areas:

- Poverty reduction through productive activities
- Trade capacity-building
- Energy and environment

The Organization is recognized as a specialized and efficient provider of key services meeting the interlinked challenges of reducing poverty through productive activities, integrating developing countries in global trade through trade capacity-building, fostering environmental sustainability in industry, and improving access to clean energy.

UNIDO aspires to reduce poverty through inclusive and sustainable industrial development. All countries should have the opportunity to grow a flourishing productive sector, to increase their participation in international trade and to safeguard their environment.

Inclusive and sustainable industrial development (ISID) means that:

- Every country achieves a higher level of industrialization in their economies, and benefits from the globalization of markets for industrial goods and services.
- No one is left behind in benefiting from industrial growth, and prosperity is shared among women and men in all countries.
- Broader economic and social growth is supported within an environmentally sustainable framework.
- Unique knowledge and resources are combined of all relevant development actors to maximize the development impact of ISID.

HISTORY OF UNIDO IN ETHIOPIA

Ethiopia became a member of UNIDO in 1967 and the Organization started its activities in Ethiopia in 1972. Ethiopia actively served the organization as a Board member during (1991-95) and (1999-2003). UNIDO's assistance to the country has focused on technical and material assistance in agro-processing (incl. leather and textile) and manufacturing sectors, policy development, institutional training, investment promotion, product quality and standardization, and manpower training. At the country level, UNIDO's main Government counterpart institution is the Ministry of Industry, but it also collaborates closely also with the Ministry of Agriculture, Ministry of Trade, Ministry of Forest and Environment, Ministry of Water, Irrigation and Energy, Ministry of Women, Children and Youth Affairs, and the Ethiopian Investment Agency among others.
